Mains Exam Pattern:

Candidates qualifying the preliminary exams are eligible to appear for the mains exam. West Bengal mains exam consists of 8 compulsory papers and three papers on optional subject which needs to be chosen by the candidate from the list of optional subjects provided. Each of the compulsory and optional paper will carry 100 marks each. The time for each paper will be 3 hours duration.

Personal Test

Selected candidates will have to attend the Personality test i.e conducted for 100 marks. The final merit is prepared on the basis of marks secured in the mains exam and interview

4. Civil procedure Code ;
5. Criminal Procedure Code and Indian Penal Code ;
6. Indian Evidence Act ;
7. Law of Contracts and Torts and
8. Transfer of Property Act.

Optional Papers (any three to be chosen) :

1. Hindu Law ;
2. Muhammadan Law ;
3. Jurisprudence and principles of legislation ;
4. Indian Law relating to Companies and Insurance ;
5. Principles of Equity including the Law of Trusts and Specific Relief ;

6. Partnership Act ;
7. Law of Limitation and Law of Prescription ;
8. The Indian Constitution and Constitutional Law.
